PAWNEE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

DECEMBER 1, 2020

The Pawnee County Board of Commissioners met in regular session, which was open to the public, on Tuesday, December 1, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. in the first-floor meeting room in the Pawnee County Courthouse, Pawnee City, Nebraska. Notice of such meeting was published in the November 26, 2020 issue of the Pawnee Republican. Present were Dennis Schardt, Jan Lang, Ron Seitz and County Clerk, Candi Nicholas. Chairman Schardt opened the meeting and announced the open meeting law poster is posted on the east wall. Lang moved and Seitz seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the November 17, 2020 Commissioner meeting. Voting: Schardt (abstain), Lang (yes), Seitz (yes). The Board reviewed the certification of abstract of votes cast for Pawnee County Commissioner District 1.

Mary Moser, UNL Extension Educator, met with the Board and informed them that the Extension office will be closed December 21st through January 3rd.

Braden Lang, Sheriff, met with the Board. The Sheriff office has ordered a new vehicle that should be delivered sometime in February. They are facing staffing issues and they are going to advertise in neighboring counties in Kansas along with Nebraska. Braden discussed possible 2nd Amendment issues that could occur under the new presidential administration. There is discussion with Johnson County for an interlocal agreement for deputies to help across county lines.

Laura Osborne, Project Director Four County Juvenile Services, met with the Board and gave annual updates. There is no application for grants at this time, as the Nebraska Crime Commission is currently changing the application process. Laura is hoping to be back in February for the annual application with the Crime Commission. Juvenile Services are now also working with NE Children's & Family Foundation.
